Destination Imagination (DI) Challenges are all about fostering creativity, courage, and curiosity and teaching students how to think, not what to think. Each year, we

offer seven different open-ended academic Challenges in the fields of STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics), fine arts, service learning, and early learning.

Schools throughout 30+ countries often run DI as an after-school program or incorporate it into their electives curriculum. If your school doesn't offer DI, however, your children can still participate.

APPRAISERS:

Each team attending the affiliate tournament must supply one appraiser. Training will be provided. Appraisers are not guaranteed to see performances outside of their challenge area. Suggestions for this position are friends from work, former DI team managers or team members (older than 18), neighbors, teachers, youth pastors etc.

VOLUNTEERS:

Each team attending the tournament is required to provide two part time volunteers. Typical part time volunteer tasks include door monitor, sales, registration, etc., for approximately 2 hours the day of the tournament. As a part time volunteer, your volunteers will be able to watch their team's Central Challenge.

CHALLENGE OVERVIEWS



TECHNICAL

The world is full of changes, both big and small. So grab the wheel – let's see them all!

- Design and build a vehicle able to carry at least one team member across the presentation site multiple times.
- Change the vehicle propulsion system and the vehicle movement method during the presentation.
- Create and present a story about change. The story will include a change in a character.
- Create and present two Team Choice Elements that show off the team's interests, skills, areas of strength, and talents.



IN PLAIN SIGHT

SCIENTIFIC

Now you see me, now you don't! But wait...what's the twist??

- Research the many ways that camouflage is used by organisms in nature.
- Showcase camouflage research in the visible appearance of an organism.
- Create and present a story with a plot twist that is caused by the use of camouflage.
- Apply camouflage methods to an original, team-designed and created set piece or prop.
- Create and present two Team Choice Elements that show off the team's interests, skills, areas of strength, and talents.



MUSICAL MASHUP

STRUCTURAL

Hold it together and let it play out in this musical mashup.

- Design and build a structure that both supports weight and is a musical instrument.
- Play a musical solo using the structure as a musical instrument.
- Tell a story with at least one musical character.
- Integrate the story with the weight placement testing of the structure.
- Create and present two Team Choice Elements that show off the team's interests, skills, areas of strength, and talents.



GET A CLUE

FINE ARTS

Whodunnit? Reach back in time to get a clue!

- Present a mystery story set on Earth in a team-chosen time period before 1990.
- Discover, live on stage, which of the three suspect characters is responsible for the mystery.
- Include a TechniClue that helps solve the mystery.
- Present in the style of traverse staging.
- Create and present two Team Choice Elements that show off the team's interests, skills, areas of strength, and talents.

- Research Challengeprovided confined spaces.

- Use the creative process to identify, design, plan, and carry out a project that addresses a real community need.
- Plan and carry out at least one community event that is designed to help meet the project goal(s).
- Create an effective meme to help meet the project goal(s).
- Create a live presentation that highlights the project and the impact it made on the community.
- Create and present two Team Choice Elements that show off the team's interests, skills, areas of strength and talents.



CHANGE IN DIRECTION

EARLY LEARNING

RISING STARS!

North, south, east, or west. Hmm...which way is best?

- Learn about maps and how they are helpful to people.
- Create a play that is about a journey your team is on.
- Make a change in direction at some point during your play.
- Make a map to help your team on your journey.



INSTANT CHALLENGE

Instant Challenges require teams to engage in quick, creative and critical thin king. At a tournament, a team will receive an Instant Challenge and the materials with which to solve it. The team members must think on their feet by applying appropriate skills to produce a solution in a period of just five to eight minutes.

Instant Challenges are performance-based, task-based, or a combination of the two. Although each Instant Challenge has different requirements, all Instant Challenges reward teams for their teamwork and the creativity of their solutions. Instant Challenges are kept confidential until the day of the Tournament.

Staff Sergeant US Army from Northern Cass Destination Imagination

I am currently a SSgt in the Army, stationed in Fort Riley, KS. I have been enlisted for 6 years. I have done two tours overseas in Iraq and Afghanistan. My training has taken me all over the United States. I work on AH-64 Apache Helicopters. My hometown is Hunter, ND.

How did you get started with DI?

I moved to a new school and started on a DI team in 5th grade because my new best friend asked me to join him.

Best memory of DI?

My best memory is going to [Global Finals] in TN two times. Pin trading was awesome; I still have the pins I collected years ago. I remember sitting in the audience after my challenge watching how other teams chose to solve it. I really enjoyed walking in the parade at opening ceremony.

How did Destination Imagination prepare you for what you are doing today?

As a SSgt, I am the leader of a large team. I use the skills I gained by problem solving complex problems and thinking outside the box. Using my team building skills from DI I am able to gather other people's ideas and utilize them. Being at Nationals helped prepare me to be culturally aware.

What is the most important thing that you learned in Destination Imagination?

There are always going to be challenges in life, it is how you think and work to overcome them that matter.

What does Destination Imagination mean to you? Creativity and Unlimited Possibilities

How did you gain problem solving skills with Destination Imagination?

Instant Challenge is what I really loved to do. While I was at basic training my team was given the challenge of getting our squad across an obstacle using very limited equipment and not touching the ground. Many people were confused and had no idea as to how this could be possible. I just thought of it as a giant Instant Challenge that we could solve together. Mine was the only squad

that was successful in completing the mission.

Thanks to my involvement in DI, I have the skills necessary in my career to be a quick problem solver and a team leader which has helped me further my career at a higher pace.
